<i>Eleocharis</i>	<i>palustris</i>	great spike rush	1-2 ft	may not tolerate drought periods	grass-like leaves	xx000
<i>Hypericum</i>	<i>pyramdatum</i>	great St. John's wort	4-6 ft	mod moist soil but not soggy	forb	oxx00
<i>Vernonia</i>	<i>fasciculata</i>	iron weed	4-6 ft	mod moist soil but not soggy	forb	oxx00
<i>Eupatorium</i>	<i>maculatum</i>	joe-pye weed	4-6 ft	may not tolerate drought periods	forb	xx000

<i>Mimulus</i>	<i>ringens</i>	monkey flower	1-3 ft	may not tolerate drought periods	forb	xx000
<i>Pycnanthemum</i>	<i>virginianum</i>	mountain mint	1-3 ft	wet to moderately dry soil	forb	xxx00
<i>Allium</i>	<i>cernuum</i>	nodding onion	1-2 ft	mod moist soil but not soggy	grass-like leaves	oxxx0
<i>Tradescantia</i>	<i>ohioensis</i>	ohio spiderwort	2-3 ft	mod moist soil but not soggy	grass-like leaves	oxxxx
<i>Liatris</i>	<i>pycnostachya</i>	prairie blazing star	3-4 ft	wet to moderately dry soil	forb	xxx00
<i>Carex</i>	<i>interior</i>	prairie star sedge	1-3 ft	wet to moderately dry soil	grass-like leaves	xxx00
<i>Thalictrum</i>	<i>dasycarpum</i>	purple meadow rue	5-7 ft	mod moist soil but not soggy	forb	oxx00
<i>Filipendula</i>	<i>rubra</i>	queen of the prairie	3-5 ft	may not tolerate drought periods	forb	xx000
<i>Eupatorium</i>	<i>purpureum</i>	savanna joe-pye weed	4-6 ft	mod moist soil but not soggy	forb	oxxx0
<i>Ludwigia</i>	<i>alternifolia</i>	seedbox	1-3 ft	may not tolerate drought periods	forb	xx000
<i>Helenium</i>	<i>autumnale</i>	sneezeweed	2-5 ft.	may not tolerate drought periods	forb	xx000
<i>Asclepias</i>	<i>incarnata</i>	swamp milkweed	3-5 ft	wet to moderately dry soil	forb	xxx00
<i>Acorus</i>	<i>calamus</i>	sweet flag	1-3 ft	do not confuse with blue flag iris	grass-like leaves	xx000
<i>Juncus</i>	<i>torreyi</i>	Torrey's rush	1-2 ft	mod moist soil but not soggy	grass-like leaves	oxx00

<i>Elymus</i>	<i>virginicus</i>	Virginia wild rye	2-4 ft	wet to moderately dry soil	grass	xxx00
<i>Clematis</i>	<i>virginiana</i>	virgin's bower	vine	may get overgrown	forb	0xx00
<i>Phlox</i>	<i>divaricata</i>	wild blue phlox/woodland b.ph.	0.5-2 ft	mod moist soil but not soggy	forb	0xxx0
<i>Phlox</i>	<i>maculata</i>	wild sweet William/meadow ph.	1 - 3 ft	mod moist soil but not soggy	forb	0xx00
<i>Carex</i>	<i>grisea</i>	wood gray sedge	1-2 ft	wet to moderately dry soil	grass-like leaves	xxx00

* five-step moisture scale: Xoooo = very wet, ooXoo = typical garden soil, ooooX = very dry

plants with height given in red italics will be too tall for smaller sites
